



<u>Memory Boxes</u>

Thanks to SCDP's membership for continuing to support our memory box program. For the month of August so far, we have received 9 memory boxes, bringing our yearly total to 63, well on our way to a goal of 70 boxes for 2023.

I dropped off 13 boxes to the Chaplain's office at Long Beach Memorial Hospital on Tuesday, August 15. While speaking with the Reverend, she said that for the first 15 days of August, 8 babies passed away; with the most recent happening that morning. She said there are not many answers as to why so many babies were lost in such a short period of time; some could be anomalies or stillbirth. So, the need for painted memory boxes continues. She also said that several of the mothers have commented about how beautiful the memory boxes are that they receive to hold precious mementos of their baby. We only hope that our painted boxes provide a moment of comfort to the families that receive them.

Our last Memory Box Paint-along of 2023 will take place on Monday, November 6, 2023. We are working on the details and more information will be available soon, but what we can share is that we will have a teacher and our project will use JoSonja acrylics and colored pencils. As soon as the details are finalized, an email will be sent to the membership. Many of us have done projects using acrylics and colored pencils but if you aren't familiar with this medium, this project would be a great way to learn.

Please remember our pledge as SCDP members, that we will paint one memory box per year. Many of our members have painted multiple boxes throughout the year, and we appreciate your commitment to the memory box program. Package Mailing Tip

Use a program called Parcel Path (ship.parcelpath.com) You have to agree to UPS information that comes up, but you can ship USPS or UPS. In the menu on the left side, you can select "Rate Quote" and you can select service: USPS or UPS and by entering the destination zip code, the length, width, pounds and ounces it will give you the price of shipping by Ground, Priority or Express.

I just use a kitchen scale to weigh the parcel/oversized envelope. On the main screen, in the upper right corner click on Create Shipment. You fill in the recipient's information, length, width, pounds and ounces, date you wish to mail it and it will print an address label to affix to the parcel. You just drive to the post office closest to you and drop it off. No lines to stand in.
